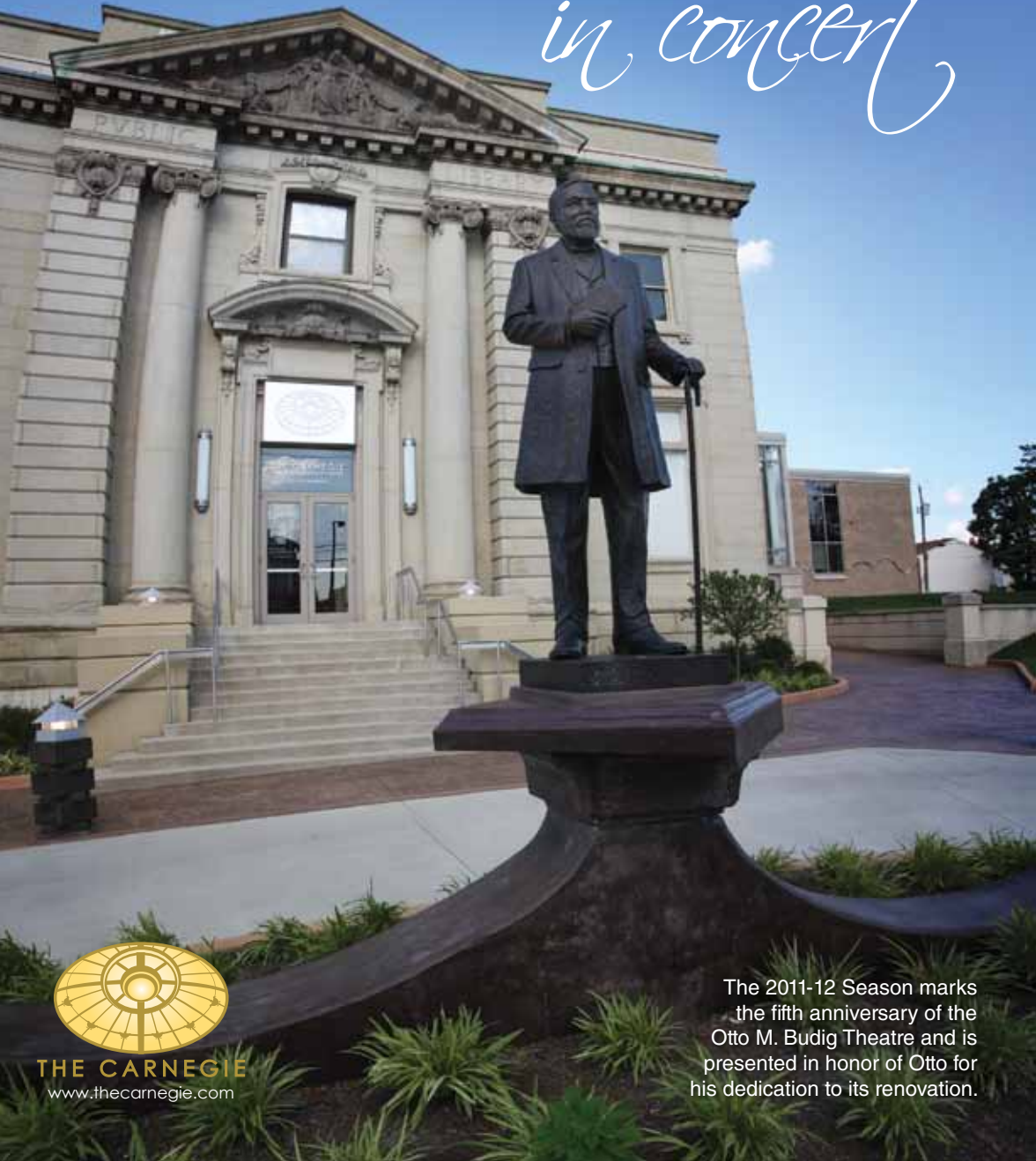

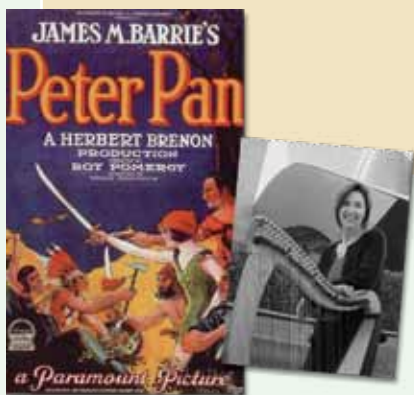
**The Mind and Music of Beethoven with

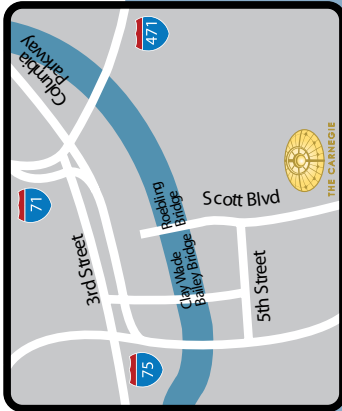

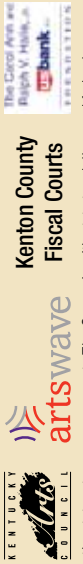
